

Igor Kavass was a leading scholar of international law and onetime visiting librarian and law professor at Richardson.



He was born in Latvia and emigrated to Australia, eventually ending up teaching law in Australia and the US and living in more than a dozen countries.

He was the initial compiler of the United States Treaty Index, indexing agreements, slip treaties, and treaties not published in Treaties and Other International Acts
