LAW SCHOOL ARCHIVE

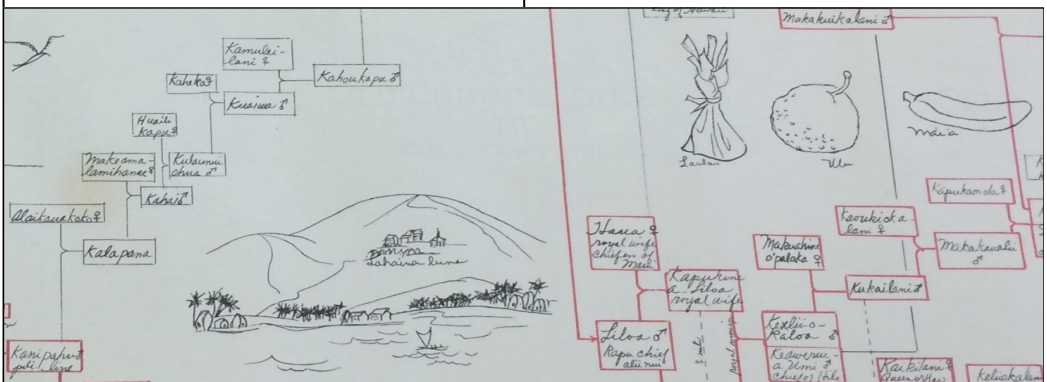
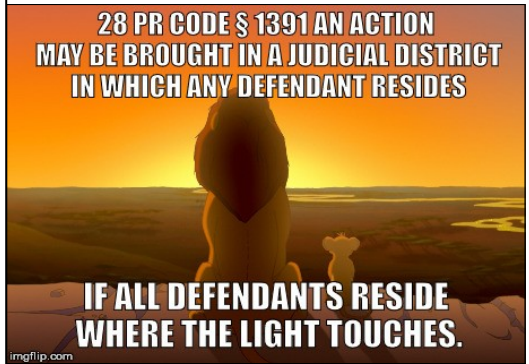
Did you know that the School has an archive? It's behind that door in the back labeled "Intensive Book Storage."

The archive contains various collections, including School history and photos and a handwritten genealogy of CJ Richardson going back about 30 generations. It's on a poster 5 1/2

feet long! One day, the archive hopes to also acquire CJ's papers so they can be preserved for future generations.

The archive does contain the papers of Judge Samuel King, who served as a state court judge before being appointed to the federal district court in Hawai'i.
